



















THE FACTS

15-20% of inpatients had diabetes

- 33% of insulin treated patients had a chart error
- >25% experienced a hypoglycaemic episode
- One in 30 acquired a new foot lesion as in-patient
- One in six described their experience as negative

IN SCOTLAND

12-20% of inpatients have diabetes


12% of Scottish inpatient expenditure spent on patients with diabetes



Diabetes in Scottish Hospitals

This work addresses inpatient diabetes care, in particular patients admitted to acute hospitals with a secondary diagnosis of diabetes.

The prevalence of diabetes in the Scottish population is increasing





EDUCATION

Diabetes specialists provide direct feedback to ward staff during data collection and education to junior doctors. Diabetes specialist nurses run 'drop-in' teaching sessions for ward staff on: patient assessment, how to treat a hypoglycaemic episode, and safe use of insulin. The healthcare e-academy 'Safe Use of Insulin' e-learning module is also promoted to all staff.




MEASUREMENT

A measurement package was developed and data collected to measure whether the changes to improving patient care were being worked towards.




RESOURCES

Wards are testing and implementing resources such as an assessment sticker magnets to identify patients who have diabetes on the ward whiteboard and assessment criteria posters.




Level 9, Western Infirmary, NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde Suit of Measures, control charts



Intervention
